News

A lot has happened in force over the last 12 months:

We received nearly 200,000 calls to 999 and more than 300,000 to 101

We received 36,000 reports online

We received more than 3,300 reports of missing people

We created more than 245,000 reports and recorded more than 110,000 crimes

We made more than 14,000 arrests

Our vehicles travelled a combined total of more than three million miles

In 2022, Leicestershire Police has been analysing how they can put the right resources in the right place at the right time to prevent and detect burglary.

Operation Fortune, running in the Hinckley and Blaby area since September, has seen increased proactive police patrols, leading to 32 arrests and 19 properties searched for stolen material. Stolen property has been recovered including vehicles, drugs and cash. Burglary has reduced in the area by 40%.

More than £5m worth of assets have been seized from criminals under the Proceeds of Crime Act (POCA) since 2020. In the last two years numerous high-value items have been seized or identified under confiscation orders granted by the courts.

Confiscation orders are granted by the courts following the conviction of individuals where there is evidence to support the defendant has gained financially from their crimes.

Members of the force's economic crime unit are responsible for preparing the evidence to support the confiscation orders. At times this can be a complex and challenging task with criminals attempting to hide their cash and assets amongst family members.

CRIME UPDATES - #YouSaidWeDid -Please find below updates from your local beat team in relation to the priorities you have raised via Neighbourhood Link:

You Said – Anti-Social Behaviour

We Did – We have seen a return of knock door run incidents in Leicester Forest East, groups of young people have been spoken to whilst the beat team have been patrolling the area. If you are experiencing issues similar please report them to us via 101 or our website.

You Said – Residential Burglary

We Did – In the last week a suspect has been arrested for a number of burglaries including ones that happened on the beat. This arrest is in result to our CID department putting in some great work. Although someone has been arrested the hard work continues.

You Said – Vehicle Crime

We Did – We are aware of people going around and trying car doors across the area and we are patrolling across the beat to deter and hopefully capture those responsible. Don't make it easy for them leaving vehicles insecure or valuables/cash/cards in your car we are seeing an increase in cards being used if found in cars due to the increased spending limit of contactless transactions. Don't get caught out.

You Said – Road Safety

We Did – The beat team have spent time around the schools as we are still receiving a few complaints in relation to poor parking.

#InYourCommunity - Beat Surgeries –

New beat surgeries will be created by new members of the beat team.
