Trees

As reported in the last LiFE, all the trees in the two parks and the spinney had been surveyed and urgent work had been completed. Non urgent work has also now been completed. Late last year



Leicestershire County Council offered free tree packs to the parish council and an order was place for two packs one for large trees the other for small ones. Our newest councillor, David Dawes volunteered to plant them, which he has almost completed. Thank you, David.

Noticeboards

There are now six parish council noticeboards in our area. There used to be nine but three were taken away because they needed repairing or replacing. We have



been investigating the possibility of putting a noticeboard on the land in front of the Forest Park Restaurant and Hotel. However, I wonder if parishioners want more physical noticeboards, if so where, or whether we should communicate in other ways. We already have a website and Facebook page. Wildflower Area on Forest East Park

Work will soon be starting on a wildflower area between the park and playing fields. There will be more seats and also flower tubs. The idea behind



the garden is that it will be a peaceful place for residents to sit and relax. The introduction of wildflowers will also encourage wildlife, especially bees, to thrive in the area.

I am pleased to say that the MUGA was completed earlier this year. It is located next to the parish hall and is already being well

Former councillor Paul Fox did a lot of work at the start of this process and when he resigned from the council, Peter Kitchen took up the reigns. I would like to thank both of them for the hard work they put in and also for their patience, when, through no fault of theirs, delays occurred.



Planning, Trees and Highways Committee

Many of you are concerned over the speed of cars along Warren Lane and Forest House Lane, coupled with road parking around the doctors surgery and also school bus drop off point.



Many of you will know that there was an accident involving a child at school bus drop off time. We are working with the South Charnwood High School and Desford Bosworth Academy to move the bus drop off points into a better location, further away from the surgery and all the related parking issues.

As of writing, Orbit have agreed with all the concerns raised and have moved their drop off point. Parents and carers will have been made aware of this change.

Vista have applied for planning permission to redevelop their site on Hinckley Road, next to St. Andrews Church. As you will have seen permission was granted to demolish the house and bungalows prior to any further works. Vista have been very pro-active with the parish council and residents as to their plans and we are pleased that they have taken any local concerns seriously in their proposed designs for the facility. We believe it will be an asset to LFE. Members of the parish council will

have met with Vistas' CEO on a site visit to hear more of the works planned and the use of the facility.

It is pleasing to see that the buildings at the junction of Charnwood Drive and Hinckley Road (The Learning Centre and Candy Heads) have been or are in the process of redevelopment and that area will be much improved. We look forward to the new 'deli' opening there

Planning permission has not been given yet for the housing development on Baines Lane and any works there are for exploratory reasons. Blaby enforcements are ensuring works do not start until all permissions are given. The parish council shares residents' concerns that during any building works access is NOT via South Avenue and related streets but via Hinckley Road / Baines Lane only.

Generally, traffic is a concern for LFE residents, and we do follow up any complaints and issues. This is done with and through our district and county councillors as well as fed into Leicestershire County Council Highways department who have the controlling hand. It is often very frustrating not to see any progress or understanding of the issues we face. But we do ensure that traffic issues are always highlighted as an issue on any major planning developments or proposals.

"Well, there is an alternative" she replied, "My friend loves to go to LFE Parish Hall every month* to see one of the latest films. She says it's very good, and the atmosphere is friendly and chatty".

"Mmm" he said "Sounds too good to be true! How does it all work, then?"

"From what I understand, you just turn up on the first Thursday every month, pays your £5, get a free hot drink and a biccie, choose a seat and Bob's your uncle. Oh, and your entry ticket goes into a draw to get a free double ticket for a future visit. A bargain!"

"How do you find out what's on?" was the obvious question in response.

"Well, details are usually in local magazines, as well as mini-posters on the Parish notice boards and in the local libraries. You can also contact the organisers."

It was in 2010 that Film Evenings was established as an 'open to all' venture. This means it is NOT a club – no membership is involved, nor is pre-purchase of tickets. Film Evenings is a non-profit making service to the community. It is run by a band of volunteers who set out and clear chairs, provide refreshments, operate the projector, etc. New volunteers are always welcome! The next Parish Council election will be in May 2023. If you wish to consider becoming a Parish Councillor now, co-option is available. This is where the Parish Council vote you onto the Council. You would then stand for election as usual, at the May 2023 elections.






