Welcome

Hello and welcome to the autumn 2021 edition of LiFE. It is two years since the last edition. We had one ready to be printed in March last year, but, following the announcement of the first lockdown, it was cancelled because the articles suddenly became out of date and/or irrelevant. The Parish Council had



to change its way of working, with the clerk working from home and meetings held using Zoom. However the Parish Council has managed to achieve quite a lot in the past eighteen months.

New Play Equipment - Kings Walk Park

The Parish Council secured section 106 funding to pay for part of the new installation of play equipment on Kings Walk Park. The rest of the money came from the precept. Much of the old wooden equipment had been removed due to vandalism and the Parish Council decided to replace it





with new sturdier equipment.

Resurfacing of Boyers Park

Boyers Play Park has been re-surfaced around all items of play equipment with grass carpeting. This was to replace the existing surfacing which was well-worn and did not allow for sufficient drainage,



meaning equipment could not be used after wet spells. The new surfacing provides extra draining so the Park will be usable for more of the year. (Unfortunately this matting was vandalised within weeks of installation. It looks as if it could have been caused by electric scooters and these will be banned from this play area.)

Path around Playing Fields

A new path has been installed around the perimeter of the playing fields on Forest East Park. The field is now more user-friendly and can be used by dog-walkers, cyclists, those with pushchairs and walkers.

Solar Panels

With a view to 'doing it's bit' towards tackling climate change, the Parish Council has installed solar panels on the Parish Hall roof. In addition LED lighting has been installed in the hall.



Hanging Baskets and Flower Planters

This year, the Parish Council has changed provider for hanging baskets and flower tubs and has saved money in the process. I hope you agree the planters and hanging baskets have looked fantastic this summer.



Picnic in the Park

This took place on 22 August this year. The Ratby Brass Band played for two hours and around two hundred people enjoyed the music along with food and drink they had brought with them or purchased from stalls at the event. The weather could have been kinder but the rain held off until near the end of the concert.







Tree Survey

All the trees in the two parks and the spinney have been surveyed and any urgent work has been completed. Non urgent work will be done soon.

Financial Procedures

The Parish Council now has a computerised finance system which incorporates internet banking and a hall booking facility. Financial procedures have been tightened up and the council has recently received a clean audit report.

Assistant Clerk

A new Assistant Clerk, Leigh-Ann, started working for the council on 1 September last year to help and to cover for Holly, our clerk. Because of the pandemic the interviews for this post were conducted virtually. Leigh-Ann's main task is to operate the computerised finance system, including providing councillors with monthly reports of income and expenditure.

LFE Coronavirus Volunteers

At the start of the first lockdown one or our residents, Kelly Mobbs, set up a Coronavirus WhatsApp group. Within days forms had been delivered to every house in LFE, giving the name and phone number of a volunteer for the householder to contact if they needed help. A number of people replied to these forms, but there were also referrals from Blaby District Council and via the parish council. All requests for help were put on the

WhatsApp group, which had over fifty members offering their help. The volunteers did shopping, collected prescriptions and phoned people who just wanted to hear a friendly voice. I would like to thank all the volunteers, in particular Kelly. The Parish Council has nominated Kelly for a Volunteer Award under Blaby District Council's Community Awards. This is to say thank you for all the hard work she did organising volunteers and ensuring everyone in LFE had the supplies they needed.

Other News

The Parish Council started face to face meetings in May and the hall re-opened to hirers in July. There will soon be an industrial dishwasher provided for hirers to use.

The Parish Council has been out to tender for a MUGA (multi-use games area), which will be located next to the Parish Hall. Work to install this should begin in the next few weeks.

There are three vacancies for Parish Councillors and so, if you would like to help us improve your area, please contact Holly at the Parish Office.

I hope all readers have a good autumn/winter.

Planning, Trees and Highways Committee

After a long period, the LFE Neighbourhood Plan was submitted to Blaby DC for final consultation and as of writing this article in mid-September we await the results of the external examiners review but are confident that the Plan will be adopted in the near future.



Our thanks to those residents who helped us in writing the plan way back when!! We are nearly then after a number of frustrating delays.

The last 16 months have seen an explosion in planning applications from many residents and others in LFE and the council has a duty to review and comment on each one, if applicable. In most cases the council is pleased to say that very few comments or objections are made and then only related to traffic / parking issues or where the application may not, in our opinion, fit in with the street scenes already in place. In future, once the Neighboured Plan is adopted this will form the backbone of our thinking on developments within LFE.

You may be aware and have seen that Vista (Kathleen Rutland Home), have applied for, and received permissions to demolish existing buildings, and replace with a new centre. The council have been involved with the company and its architects, etc and are pleased that issues and suggestions we made have been taken on board. Vista is committed to LFE and this project will be an asset to the area.

As we are all aware, traffic and traffic management is a big issue for LFE and we do work as closely as possible with Blaby DC, LCC Highways and our district / county councillors to mitigate issues as and when, however much is out of our direct control, which is frustrating.

Traffic calming measures as originally outlined for Warren Lane, etc. by Lubbesthorpe developers were rejected by residents and the council, but to date they have not been

interested in any other more acceptable solutions that were proposed. We await responses from all parties.

We have had a MVAS (Mobile activated speed sign) on Forest House Lane for some time now and the results do show that drivers are moving at speeds within the accepted 85 percentile limits suggested by highways. There are exceptions, with the very occasional driver being clocked at 40, 50 and even 60 mph. Whilst residents are right to be concerned about speeding, the data does show this not to be the case, and again any further action to reduce speed limits or change the layout of the road is not at this time likely.

On the subject of E-scooters, residents should be aware that usage is currently illegal in Leicestershire on all public roads (including pavements) and in public spaces. Only use on private land is permitted. Please note that parks and green spaces manged and owned by LFE PC are public spaces. Issues with E-Scooters should be directed to the police.

Residents should also be aware that they are responsible for any trees, hedges and bushes that encroach onto pavements and highways. Always ensure they are cut back to your property line, as LCC highways may contact the householder to remedy, or take further action.

We are taking on board suggestion from residents about Christmas Lights in LFE and are actively looking at other lighting ideas for 2022. This year we are retaining the existing lights, but do acknowledge they could be better, however please remember that improvements do come at cost, and whilst we are budgeting for such, that cost ultimately comes from the precept residents pay in their council tax. In the meantime, we are hoping that the lights will be more evenly distributed along Hinckley Road (plus some around Stafford Leys school,) but again we are somewhat hampered by LCC Highways as to which lampposts can be used. We will continue to review.

Forest House Medical Centre

Community Response to Consultation regarding closure

As you are aware there has been a recent consultation by Forest House Medical Centre on Park Drive to considering closing that facility and move all services to Lubbesthorpe and Warren Lane.

Many of you took part in a long discussion thread on the LFE Facebook Group which demonstrated the anger, dismay and disbelief that medical services could be removed from the eastern end of LFE. We are also grateful to all those who took time to complete the questionnaire and on-line 'virtual' event and we await the response to the many comments made. It's also pleasing to note that many were completed by folk not 'directly' impacted by the proposal.

We fully support Lubbesthorpe having its own medical facility but merging 2 huge population centres is not, we believe, the way to go.

I think we were all in agreement that the practice has not thought about the impact of such a closure and that the alternative proposals are logistically a nightmare.

As a group of residents, we have commented:

- It appears that a decision has already being made, as Park Drive FHMC is made to look unused with access through the back door!
- Many of the patients attending Park Drive surgery come from the eastern end of LFE, into Braunstone and Braunstone Town.
- Many are elderly and travelling to Lubbesthorpe would be extremely difficult.
- · No direct bus route.
- Too far to walk for many.
- Arriva 'Click and Ride' is impractical and expensive
- Travelling by car introduces more traffic on our congested roads at a time we are encouraged to reduce car use.
- Lack of parking provision. (Though it was stated that Lubbesthorpe facility would have 70 spaces they would have to be shared with local community centre, shops, staff etc)
- Closure of FHMC will likely lead to the closure of the chemists. Detriment to the community
- Depending on who owns the land / building etc LFE

- could also lose the dentist down the line. Detriment to the community.
- The practise is already receiving 500 calls a day for services from a patient list of 15,000. Adding in 10k from Lubbesthorpe and potentially 2-3K from devel opments along Hinckley Road to the west will further stretch resources.
- No mention of increasing numbers of doctors within the practice to cope with 25-30K people.
- Patients still have issues getting appointments especially those who do not use the internet.
- Patients are concerned over being 'triaged' by a 'receptionist'. At least in hospital the triage nurses are fully trained.

We are concerned that moving to a 'shiny' new facility is at the detriment to many and we believe that Park Drive can be retained as a satellite facility serving the needs of the eastern end of LFE and north Braunstone / Braunstone Town.

Whilst we would applaud having many other proposed medical and related services available, residents would travel for those services but 'seeing' a doctor is what most want in the first instance.

We hope that FHMC publishes its findings asap. Remember that this is not a done deal, whatever it seems. We don't know any outcomes and whether FHMC have listened. Also planning permissions etc have to be given and we are 2-3 years away. We can and will keep up the pressure to retain services at Park Drive FHMC.



Nature Spot Recording the Wildlife of Leicestershire & Rutland

A New Parish Wildlife Website

Leicester Forest East Parish Council now has its own feature pages on the Leicestershire and Rutland NatureSpot website. If you haven't visited the NatureSpot website yet, you are missing out on what has rapidly become the most popular resource for identifying local wildlife. NatureSpot provides a photographic guide to over 7,000 species – all found in Leicestershire and Rutland. In addition, the website invites the public to submit sightings of all wildlife seen – helping to build a picture of what lives where in the two counties.

The website is feature-packed, including pages that highlight the wildlife of parishes. Leicester Forest East Parish Council is one of these featured parishes. Here you can see a list of all the recent wildlife sightings plus images submitted with these records.

NatureSpot was set up in 2011 and is run by volunteers. All the images have been taken in Leicestershire and Rutland by the public and it is a great example of citizen science in action. Every species has its own page, with photos, descriptions, ID tips and where and when to see it. It also describes how common or rare it is, both in Leicestershire and in the UK as a whole, with live maps showing every sighting. As you add a sighting, a new dot appears on the map. It also keeps track of all your submitted records, allowing you to sort, filter and download any aspect of your list.

Thousands of local people have contributed, with numbers growing every month, and even more visit the website to view what's been seen and to use the wildlife galleries help identify species they've seen. Monthly visits exceed 100,000 per month. The data collected is put to good use and is shared with local and national recording schemes, as well as managers of nature reserves and other sites of wildlife importance. The data helps to inform decision-making about how best to manage land for conservation.

Anyone can submit a wildlife record and the website makes this really easy. Common species are just as important to record as rare species in order to monitor changes in population and distribution over time.

Gardens are one of the best places to start your wildlife recording, as well as local parks and open spaces. What visits your bird feeders? Do you see butterflies in the garden? Do you have a pond with frogs? Register with the website and start to record straight away. The form even has a map that you simply click to fill in the grid reference. You can attach a photo to your record if you have one, but this isn't a requirement. Photos are however a great way to provide evidence of your sightings and can also be emailed to NatureSpot for identification help if you are not sure.

Occasionally species turn up that have not been recorded on NatureSpot before and these are then added to the library and given a new species page. Indeed there have been a significant number of new species seen that are completely new to Leicestershire. So how many more species are there to be found? The truth is that no-one knows and in any case the picture changes all the time with some species expanding their range and others declining. Some of the most commonly recorded species are Little Egrets, Red Kites and Harlequin Ladybirds that would have been very rare sightings just 10 years ago.

The website also has pages highlighting many of the county's nature reserves, country parks and other significant 'wild places', there is a NatureChat forum to exchange views with other visitors – and a new 'Explore' feature – an interactive map where you can see a map of your own records or those for a species or a locality that you choose. If you have an interest in wildlife you will enjoy NatureSpot – and why not make your own contribution to science and conservation by submitting records of your own wildlife sightings?
