




Hello and welcome to the Autumn 2022 edition of LiFE. A lot has happened since my article in the Spring edition of the magazine, both nationally and locally. I will concentrate on things that have happened in LFE.



No longer blots on the landscape

Some improvements have taken place on Hinckley Road. Poppy's opened in what was the Bargain Booze shop, which had been empty for years. Go and support this local business. They sell a variety of good food and drinks to consume there or to takeaway.

Nisa is also open in the building where Sainsbury's was and the car park in front of the shop has been resurfaced.

The car park in front of the vape and chip shops has also been partially resurfaced.

Picnic in the Park

For the second year running we had live music in the park. This year, in addition to the excellent Ratby Brass Band, the Quorn Ukulele Orchestra played a set of popular songs ranging from Rock Around the Clock to George Ezra's Shotgun. They also did Rocking All Over The World, as you would expect from a band whose abbreviated name is QUO.

There will be another Picnic in the Park on Sunday 27 August next year and, for a change, we are looking to book a different type of band.

Neighbourhood Development Plan

In July Blaby District Councillors adopted the Neighbourhood Plan for Leicester Forest East after being approved in a referendum.

Neighbourhood Plans are used by the District Council when planning applications are decided, in addition to their Local Plan and other material considerations. A referendum took place on Thursday 30 June, with residents of LFE backing the Neighbourhood Plan with 85% of the votes cast. The District Council formally approved the plan to be used as part of the legal process Neighbourhood Plans must go through.

LFE Film Evenings

Film evenings have been taking place in the Parish Hall since 2010. They were started by Pat and Dennis Walker

and have been run by them, ably assisted by volunteers. Up until the Covid 19 pandemic, high audience attendance figures meant the film evening was financially secure. However, since the film evening started back after the pandemic, the audience numbers have been low. So much so that it was no longer breaking even financially.

The Parish Council decided to take over the running of the finance side of things with Pat, Dennis and volunteers continuing to run the administration side. The council wants this evening to continue as a community event.

Film evenings are on the first Thursday of each month, except July and August. Doors open at 7pm with the film starting 7.30pm. Entrance is free and includes hot drinks and biscuits.

Vandalism

As reported in the last edition of LiFE, the Parish Council obtained free tree packs from Leicestershire County Council. Councillor David Dawes planted them and within a matter of days most of the saplings had been broken down. The Parish Council wants to improve the area for all residents and so it is extremely sad and annoying when a small minority of residents destroy our efforts. The 'spider' on Spider Park was recently repainted and, before the paint had time to dry, graffiti had been scratched in. In addition to this, broken glass has been left in the play area on this park. Words fail me.

Wildflower Garden on **Forest East Park**

Work has started on a Wildflower Garden between the park and playing fields. There will be more seats and also flower tubs and a path round it to access the seats. The idea behind the garden is that it will be a peaceful place for residents to sit and relax. The introduction of wildflowers will also encourage wildlife, especially bees, to thrive in the area



Planning, Trees and Highways

The Parish Council are pleased to see that Vista (Kathleen Rutland) have been given planning permission to develop the site off Hinckley Road. Vista have been very open in their plans for the site and the development will be a great improvement for the area. As well as working with



and supporting people with sight loss there will also be a small community hub with a shop and café together with a gym facility open to LFE residents.

It is good to see that the Sainsbury's site remained unused for only a short period, and we welcome NISA Grocers into our community.

In other news, there are no planning permission for the development proposed around the Rugby Club and, whilst situated in Kirby Muxloe Parish, LFE Parish Council continue to highlight the impact of another 800+ homes on LFE infrastructure.

Additionally, the development off Baines Lane is subject to further planning review due to objections from Leicestershire Highways over access. Again, the Parish Council and our District Councillors are fighting to ensure that if the development goes ahead then there is no access for construction traffic from Wardens Walk, Holmfield Avenue East and West, Park Drive and St Marys Avenue. Also, we have proposed that householder access is again via Baines Lane. However, this is less likely as Baines Lane is controlled by National Highways who

are, it seems, refusing to allow access via that route.

Dare I say it, but Christmas is on the horizon, and we hope that residents will approve of the new Christmas lighting we have arranged. Official lighting of the Parish Christmas Tree, etc. will be at 6.30pm on Thursday 1st December at St. Andrews Church with music and

As regards traffic, there are obvious concerns over speeding (or inappropriate speeds) along Forest House Lane, Warren Lane, and Beggars Lane. We are pleased that the school buses have been able to move their drop of points on Warren Lane to alleviate some concerns. However, there are still issues due to accidents with children in that area and the Council are actively pursuing solutions with relevant authorities and interested parties. We will be holding site meetings with these people in the near future.

Our District Councillors are seeking TPOs (Tree Preservation Orders) on many of the trees in our community (not controlled / owned by residents and the Parish Council) especially thinking of those along Hinckley Road.

The Council continue to welcome constructive and pertinent comments from residents on all matters related to our planning infrastructure and roads. And, again, as a Council we would welcome new faces to join the Council.

The recent passing of Her Majesty the Queen has shocked us all but her reign will be one that we all remember with great fondness, and respect, for someone that dedicated their entire life to this Country.

Things in Leicester Forest East continue to improve in particular with our air quality, however there is still lots to do to improve the Traffic flow along the A47 and ensure the improvement in our air quality continues year on year.

Trees are renowned for improving air quality and I am looking at the possibility / feasibility of having a blanket "Tree Preservation Order" placed on ALL trees within Leicester Forest East, however there is certain criteria that has to be followed and trees that are viewed by everyone will receive priority, then trees in open spaces with public access. well hit a few hurdles, but I am positive most of you will welcome that fact that TPO's will protect the wonderful array of well established trees in Leicester Forest East, particularly those that line the A47 the full length of the Parish, and they will ensure that the trees remain in Leicester Forest East for our children and grandchildren to enjoy for may years to come, and protect the environment we all live in too. I will keep you updated on developments in my future reports on this subject.

I had many calls from residents voicing their approval of the extension / refurbishment of the Vista blind home in Leicester Forest East and in August after many months of discussions with the County Council Highways department at County Hall, the Planning Committee at Blaby District Council approved the application, and over the coming months we will all see this new venture evolve which in turn when completed will provide world class services to the blind and needy people that have relied on Vistas support for many, many years. Its great to know that Leicester Forest East residents will continue to help and support users of this fantastic facility for the blind.

Yet again the flower tubs in Leicester Forest East look wonderful along with the array of lamp post hangers too, and I am sure that I speak for most residents when I say I must say a big Thank You to the Parish Council for looking after the Parish so well. Your undivided attention and support to the Parish is very much appreciated, as is your continual hard work looking after the parks and recreational areas within Leicester Forest East. Blaby District Council Maintenance Team look after all the open spaces and green areas within the Parish, and the team really are dedicated in providing none other than an exemplary service at all times. – many residents have contacted me and commented on what a good job they do.
