- Canopy A canopy has been erected over the main entrance to the Parish Hall.

Bus, St John Ambulance, Vista Mobile Support Service van, Glyn's Super Whippy 'Eyes Cream' van, and several interactive activities allowing visitors to appreciate what it is like to live with sight loss.

Lesia Smaditch, the organiser of the event said "With Vista's Kathleen Rutland home on our doorstep, I thought it would be a great opportunity to raise awareness of sight loss as well as promote good eye health. The exhibition was a great success with around 150 people visiting the various stands.

Everyone I spoke to talked about new things they had learned about sight loss. I am so happy to share with you all that we raised a wonderful £1200 for Vista and I know that the charity will benefit greatly from this money. Thank you to everyone who volunteered and participated."

The evening ended with the Musical Village Summer Concert featuring the beautiful voice of soprano soloist Denise Leigh, who became famous after winning Channel 4's Operatunity. She and her accompanist, Stefan Andrusyschyn, wowed the audience with a variety of film music. The concert was compered by Dave Andrews DL who introduced Libby Clegg MBE, an inspirational

paralympic gold medal winning sportswoman who spoke about her life. Local musicians, Mark Hemmings and Andy Carvill, introduced the audience to the soothing sound of the harmonica and Slavko Madylus charmed the audience with his personal stories and songs from Ukraine. Musical Village duets, ensembles and choirs entertained with a range of music for every taste, but it was the Vista Voices choir and soloists who stole everyone's hearts with their amazing singing. # Planning, Trees and Highways

As you will be aware, Blaby
District Council, Planning
Committee passed the outline
planning application for 850
homes on the land north of the
A47 around the rugby club.
Our district councillors, Stuart
Coar, Dhillon Shikotra and Matt
Tomeo have worked extremely
hard behind the scenes and at



planning meetings to fight this development arguing that the infrastructure especially around traffic issues on the A47 was not acceptable.

As you will recall from the last LiFE magazine, the BDC planning committee in April voted to defer any decision until Leicestershire County Highways explained their reasoning and small modifications to junctions on the A47 would alleviate the issues. Highways would not meet the planning committee and indicate that they had presented sufficient data and modifications that would be acceptable.

Note that in 2019 county highways said the scheme was unacceptable due to traffic infrastructure, the same again in 2020 and 2021 but then in 2022 it was all ok.

In June the application was suddenly put back on the planning committee's agenda. Dhillon Shikotra and Matt Tomeo were on the planning committee and argued very strongly at that meeting to oppose the development on infrastructure issues. Stuart Coar (not a planning

committee member) also spoke against the development on infrastructure issues.

The Chair of the Planning Committee, Mr. Lee Breckon JP, who is also Leicestershire County councillor for Kirby Muxloe, Leicester Forest East, Leicester Forest West and Glenfield, proposed acceptance from the chair. Despite votes against from your district councillors and others of a similar mind, the decision to allow outline planning was very narrowly passed.

We do thank Dhillon, Matt and Stuart for putting the interests of Leicester Forest East residents and its parish council to the fore.

In other news the parish council has resolved to add additional Mobile Vehicle Activated Signs on Warren Lane, paid for by Highways funds allocated to our County Councillor Mr Nick Chapman. These should be already active or nearing that state at time of printing. Also, from those same funds the parish council are updating the LFE Parish signage at Braunstone Crossroads and Beggars Lane ends of the parish.

And then finally, I know it's only November, but I wish you all a Happy Christmas and New Year and that you will enjoy the improved Christmas lights along the A47. 'Switch on' is 'the 30th of November.




