Week of Police Action to combat Knife Crime.

More than 100 knives recovered, 91 education events held and 47 knife sweeps carried out – just some of our knife crime prevention work carried out as part of Operation Sceptre. The week, which ran from Monday 15 May to Sunday 21 May, was part of the national campaign carried out by all 43 police forces and the British Transport Police to help tackle knife crime. Officers in Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland focused on providing education and engagement across communities to raise awareness of the dangers of knife crime and how to prevent it.

A total of 52 community engagements, including with sports clubs and retailers, were held across the week as well as 39 workshops in schools. Since November 2022, a total of 332 knives have been placed in Amnesty Bins at Police Stations across the Force.

## Crime Prevention

**A reminder to Gardeners and Allotment holders to make sure your tools, equipment and sheds are kept secure. A strong padlock and a Shed Alarm should be purchased and any shed window covered to prevent others seeing inside. Take any portable tools out and mark equipment with a UV Pen and make a note of serial numbers on larger garden items such as Cultivators if these have to be left.**

### Road Safety

Parking close to schools during drop off and pick up times

continues to cause problems for local residents as well as schools themselves with regards to the safe entry and exit for pupils. Police encourage parents to park a safe distance from the entrance to schools and walk their children to the school gates.

Parking on pavements continues to be a problem and all drivers should park fully on the road wherever possible. If parking on the pavement is unavoidable, space must be left to enable a Double Buggy or a Mobility Scooter to pass in safety.

### ASB

During the month, a total of 9 incidents of Anti-Social Behaviour of various types have been reported to Police. This is down from the last month figure of 13.

### Burglary

During the month of May, there have been a total of 3 incidents reported to Police across the whole of the beat area. These are broken down as 1 against residential properties and 2 against a commercial property.

### Vehicle Crime

During the month of May, there have been a total number of 13 incidents reported to Police across the whole of the beat area. This figure has decreased by 3 compared to April, 2023.

These are broken down as 7 incidents of Theft from a Motor Vehicle and 6 actual thefts of a Motor Vehicle.
