Proceeds of Crime Act.

Twenty-Seven members of an Organised Crime Gang have been handed confiscation orders worth more than £1.2 million. The gang were involved in the supply of Class A drugs.

One member said to have benefited by more than £300,00 was ordered to pay back £225,042 through the sale of available assets

A second member who benefited by £500,000, received a twenty year prison sentence and ordered to pay £57,374 through the sale of assets.

A third member who benefited by more than £127,000 received a nineteen year prison sentence and was ordered to pay £55,703 through the sale of assets.

Crime Prevention - Vehicle Crime

Vehicle crime is unfortunately a constant blight in our communities. Unfortunately a large percentage of vehicle crime occurs because opportunists are being given an easy time by members of the public not locking their vehicles. Here are a few further tips to consider when thinking about vehicle security:

- Leave it on show expect it to go. Always remove valuables from your vehicle
- Remove Satnavs including cradles and their sucker marks
- Don't leave tools in vans overnight
- If you have a garage use it
- If you have a catalytic convertor then consider a metal cage or getting it etched

Road Safety

Parking close to schools during drop off and pick up times continues to cause problems for local residents as well as schools themselves with regards to the safe entry and exit for pupils. Police encourage parents to park a safe distance from the entrance to schools and walk their children to the school gates.

Parking on pavements continues to be a problem and all drivers should park fully on the road wherever possible. If parking on the pavement is unavoidable, space must be left to enable a Double Buggy or a Mobility Scooter to pass in safety.

ASB

During the month, a total of 13 incidents of Anti-Social Behaviour of various types have been reported to Police.

Burglary

During the month of April, there have been a total of 12 incidents reported to Police across the whole of the beat area. These are broken down as 11 against residential properties and 1 against a commercial property.

Vehicle Crime

During the month of April, there have been a total number of 16 incidents reported to Police across the whole of the beat area.

These are broken down as 10 incidents of Theft from a Motor Vehicle and 6 actual thefts of a Motor Vehicle.
