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Tree Warden Risk Assessment

This risk assessment covers the works of the parish Tree Warden and any future Tree Wardens.

Tree Wardens are people who volunteer to be appointed by their community group, resident's association, parish council or community council to gather information and to encourage practical projects relating to trees in the community.

Slips/Trips/Falls when tending to trees.	Tree warden – injury to limbs/head/body.	The parks are inspected weekly for safety. Litter	Tree Warden could be injured due to slipping on a piece of litter in the park, or a sharp piece of litter being left in the parks. wear appropriate	Manual Handling	Tree Warden - Moving large objects such as saplings, reaching, bending or twisting. Stooping, top heavy bending (bending from the waist using the back), can lead to strained, pulled muscles, general backache. Cuts and grazes from sharp objects, leading to infection.	in the Parish office before starting any works and to inform the same when they have completed their works. Any suspicious or threatening behaviour to be reported to the Police. Tree Warden to lift and move items using their legs to bend, not their back. Tree Warden not to handle very heavy items alone.
